MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN YELLOW RIBBON SINGAPORE AND RESUMIFY TO EMPOWER EX-OFFENDERS THROUGH AI-POWERED RESUME PLATFORM

Singapore, 28 July 2025 – Yellow Ribbon Singapore (YRSG) and Resumify signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to pilot an AI-powered resume platform aimed at supporting ex-offenders in their employment journey. The 12-month collaboration seeks to make career development tools more accessible, empowering ex-offenders to present their skills and past work experience confidently.

2. The MOU was signed by Ms Rosanna Yam, Executive Director of the Reintegration Group from YRSG, and the Resumify team comprising:
 - Mr Raymond Loong Ng, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and Co-founder
 - Mr Kenneth Chen Ko Han, Co-founder and AI Lead
 - Mr Dario Prawara Teh Wei Rong, Co-founder and Design & Marketing Lead
 - Mr Chai Pin Zheng, Co-founder and Frontend Lead
 - Mr Mohammed Khambhati, Co-founder and Operations Lead
 - Mr Stanley Koh Kuang Xiang, Software Developer
3. Resumify is a youth-led, non-profit initiative formed during Season 5 of the Youth Action Challenge organised by the National Youth Council (NYC). The Resumify team emerged as one of the six winners under the “Digital Inclusion and Safety” category and received \$24,100 in project funding. Co-founded by five Singapore Polytechnic students with technology and engineering diplomas, the team came together with a shared goal to make career tools more accessible. The idea for Resumify was sparked when the team observed how jobseekers with skills and past work experience, including ex-offenders and people with disabilities, often struggled to present their resume effectively. Resumify’s AI-powered resume platform was then created to help users surface transferable skills, personalise their resumes for job applications, and confidently navigate their next career steps. With support from NYC and early community engagement, the platform has evolved to support a broader range of jobseekers facing career challenges.
4. The MOU outlines the following areas of collaboration over the 12-month pilot:
 - Free platform access: The Resumify platform will be made freely available to ex-offenders.
 - Deployment: The pilot will be implemented to assist walk-in ex-offenders.
 - Workshops: To support users in resume building and navigating their career journey, YRSG and Resumify will jointly organise employment readiness workshops.
5. Ms Rosanna Yam said, “This partnership complements YRSG’s reintegration efforts by offering ex-offenders a user-friendly platform that makes resume writing more empowering. Together with Resumify, we aim to equip our ex-offenders with the tools and confidence to pursue meaningful career opportunities.”.
6. Mr Raymond Loong Ng said, “As students from Singapore Polytechnic, we wanted to build something real, something that could help people and impact the community positively. Partnering with Yellow Ribbon Singapore means we are one step closer to that goal. We are proud

that Resumify can support ex-offenders in rebuilding their lives through meaningful employment, and we are excited to keep learning and growing alongside the community.”.

Resumify is a youth-founded non-profit startup that leverages cutting-edge AI to help ex-offenders and persons with disabilities craft ATS-optimised resumes and navigate the job search process with greater confidence, focusing on qualifications and merit. Designed as an end-to-end employment support platform, Resumify empowers users from resume creation to opportunity matching. Co-founded by a group of five Singapore Polytechnic students from technology and engineering diplomas, the project was conceptualised during Season 5 of the Youth Action Challenge by the National Youth



Council. Awarded \$24.1k in funding, it has since expanded with new members and is now partnering with Yellow Ribbon Singapore to scale its reach and impact to the wider community.
