# EX-OFFENDERS CAN NOW LOOK FORWARD TO MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR VOCATIONAL TRAINING TO ENHANCE THEIR CAREER PROSPECTS

**Singapore, 5 March 2024** – A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed between the Catholic Welfare Services (CWS) and Yellow Ribbon Fund (YRF) to provide more opportunities for low-income ex-offenders to enhance their employment and career prospects. The MOU was signed by CWS' Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Mr Bart Lim and YRF's Secretary, Mr Sunny Lee.

- 2. Under the MOU, CWS is committing \$100,000 to *The CWS Emmanuel Second Chance Education YRF Skills Training Assistance to Restart* (CWS ESCE YRF STAR) *Bursary*. This marks the first such collaboration between CWS and YRF for eligible ex-offenders to receive funding support for vocational training. Acquiring vocational skills enhances ex-offenders' employability as it helps them secure jobs in specific sectors with the relevant skill sets. The Bursary will also fund ex-offenders for academic courses like private GCE N-, O- and A-Level, Nitec, Higher Nitec, Diploma, Degree and Graduate Diploma courses. More than 20 ex-offenders are projected to benefit from the CWS ESCE–YRF STAR Bursary for a start, which will be open for applications from April 2024.
- 3. "Today marks a special milestone as CWS partners with YRF to jointly reach out and support ex-offenders in our community. The CWS ESCE YRF STAR Bursary supports their educational or vocational pursuits to improve employability, providing them a second chance for a renewed, fresh start in their lives. This collaboration is more than just financial assistance; it's a testament to our belief in the power of second chances. Through this partnership, we hope to unlock their potential to rewrite their stories and rebuild their lives. We stand shoulder to shoulder with the YRF, committed to journeying alongside these individuals as they embrace a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and newfound purpose." said Mr Bart Lim, CEO of CWS.
- 4. "On behalf of our beneficiaries, I express our deep appreciation and gratitude to CWS for stepping forward and making a real difference in their lives. This collaboration with CWS signifies a shared commitment to empower ex-offenders to change their lives by acquiring the necessary skills for successful reintegration into the workforce, and into society. Such investment in education and skills training provides a clear pathway for these individuals to enhance their long-term employment prospects, and we believe it will go a long way towards reducing recidivism and improve the overall wellbeing of ex-offenders and their families." said Mr Sunny Lee, Secretary of YRF.
- 5. Mr Mohammad Ridzwan Bin Abdol Latiff, an ex-offender and a recipient of the YRF STAR Bursary, complimented CWS and YRF for the initiative. He said, "Not everyone follows a conventional academic path. I believe that such opportunities for skills and vocational development are instrumental in unlocking the full potential of individuals and contributing to a more inclusive and dynamic workforce."
